We hope that you are safe and healthy during this challenging time. We are reaching out to help you understand how we will communicate with you about our distance learning plan.

**a.) Materials distribution:**

-Paper materials went home Friday, March 13. Ask your child if they have their materials.  
- If they don't have their materials, we will distribute materials through pick up at the school or by dropping them off at bus stops. Students should go to their p.m. bus stop on Tuesday if they do not have materials, and our buses will be there to meet you.

-The paper materials are the key resource for your child. Even if you don't have a computer or internet at home, the materials will allow your child to continue learning.

**b.) Individual Phone Calls**

-To help you access our live classes that are available by computer and phone, our staff will be making individual calls to you. During those calls, we will explain how to join our live classes. Participating in live class can happen with a phone.

**c.) Contact Information**

We will post all contact information for staff on our FirstLine website by Tuesday morning. Reach out to your child's teacher directly with questions.

**d.) Food**

By Wednesday, March 18th, we will have food available to all children under the age of 18 and those who currently attend a public school, regardless of school affiliation. We will send a separate communication about how food can be accessed by Tuesday, March 17th.
